the economy. The model is a dynamic system of four equations:

$$\dot{K} = sY - \delta K \quad (1)$$

$$\dot{L} = \alpha Y - \delta L \quad (2)$$

$$\dot{M} = \beta Y - \delta M \quad (3)$$

where \dot{K} , \dot{L} , \dot{M} , and \dot{Y} are the time derivatives of capital, labor, money, and output, respectively.

The first equation represents the capital accumulation equation, where sY is the investment and δK is the depreciation of capital. The second equation represents the labor accumulation equation, where αY is the investment in labor and δL is the depreciation of labor. The third equation represents the money accumulation equation, where βY is the investment in money and δM is the depreciation of money. The fourth equation represents the output accumulation equation, where γY is the investment in output and δY is the depreciation of output.

The study was conducted in a laboratory setting. The participants were recruited from a local university and were assigned to two groups: a control group and an experimental group.
